

Botanical accuracy is vital to portraying plants in botanical art. Studying the botanical elements of plants will promote accuracy in your art. Simple tools, exercises and illustrations will be explored to help you understand more about botany and by creating botanical reference pages in class.



Supply List:

- Graphite drawing pencils 2B, B, HB, 2H (bring pencils you like to draw with-these are suggested) and pencil sharpener
- (or lead holder and the leads 2B, B, HB, 2H and lead pointer available at drafting supply stores)
- Assortment of colored pencils for making color references (no use of watercolor in lab room)
- Pad tracing paper any size
- Paper suitable for pencil/colored pencil/watercolor. Example: Fabriano artistico extra white #140 lb cut down to 8 ½" x 11" or larger or a sketchbook, at least 8 ½" x 11"
- Kneadable eraser
- White plastic eraser or similar white eraser
- Divider (Shaped like a compass w/ 2 sharp points instead of one)
- Optional: Hand lens, loop or magnifiers (5x or 10x)
- Optional: Portable <u>battery operated</u> light such as an Ott Lite
