## Tree Bark Up Close Betsy Rogers Knox

## **Materials List**

Watercolors:

Daniel Smith – Alizarin Crimson, Audecolin Yellow, Quinacrinine Gold, Cobalt Blue, Ultramarine Blue

Winsor-Newton – Burnt Sienna

Brushes - short handle pointed round brushes, synthetic or sable, 2-2

Palette – plastic or ceramic – 8-12 well

HB drawing pencil and eraser

Paper – 2-3 sheets of 140# Hot press – whatever you like and use.
