**Stipple Techniques in Black and White**

*Using Microns, Copic multiliner pens, Rapidograph pens or crowquill pen and ink, participants will learn to stipple – a system of fine dots that produces smooth tones. Learn how to combine stipple with line and crosshatching to create textures in pen and ink.*



**Supply List**

- Paper will be supplied
- Artists need to bring a selection of Micron pens or Copic Multiliner pens  
NOTE: pens must be fresh and crisp – not after being used for rough sketching or dried out.
  - Suggested Copic Multiliner sizes .1, .3 and .7
  - Suggested Sakura Pigma Micron sizes .1, .3 and .8
  - If you already have Rapidographs and you prefer to use them, please do.
  - If you are skilled with nib pen and ink and prefer to bring that, please do so.

Optional:

- Small brush and Chinese white watercolor or white gouache
- Small cup to hold water
