Through collective and individual teaching, this unique class, team-taught by Fiona and Robert, will focus on the detailed analysis of a variety of wet and dry applications. All levels welcome.



Supply List

Please bring your watercolour painting resources that you normally use. (Paints, brushes, container for water, board, etc.)

We never like to burden students with a specific materials shopping list as they may never require the same materials in the future, so the following is a suggested list, as we all like our own preferred brands.

- Paper. We normally use Fabriano Artistico Hot Pressed traditional white, 640gsm (300lb.). Please feel free to bring your preferred brand of hot pressed paper.
- Brushes. We use a variety of brands, Winsor and Newton Series 7 Kolinsky Sable Round. Sizes from 000, to 4 and their Series 7 Kolinsky Sable Round Miniatures
 sizes from 00 to 2. We also use L. Cornelissen and Son of London Series 22 Spotter
 and Miniature brushes (Kolinski Sable) Sizes 0, and 1. as we tend to do a lot of dry
 brush over wash technique. As application mistakes do happen we have a range of
 nylon round and square tipped brushes to lift out when required.
- Paint. Our preferred brand at present is Winsor and Newton Professional Watercolour Tubes and Pans. We use only transparent colours from their range. When using tubes we use a ceramic plate for preparing our colour as it performs best for our needs. If using pans we prefer to use the enamel lid of the pans palette.
- Ox Gall Liquid. Winsor and Newton. This is a wetting agent that we use occasionally when applying washes. We will allow you to use our supply if you do not have this already or you do not wish to purchase your own at this time.
- Lifting Preparation. Winsor and Newton. Allows dry colour washes to be lifted from paper with a wet brush. We use this on occasions. We will allow you to use our supply if you do not have this already or you do not wish to purchase your own at this time.

- **Pencils**. 2H and 2B These can be traditional or mechanical. We tend to use the mechanical type, .2, .3, .5.
- Tracing Paper
- Eraser
- Magnifying Glass
- **Light.** battery-powered daylight type, as lighting can be unpredictable.
