Using Microns, Copic Multiliner pens, Rapidograph pens or crowquill pen and ink, participants will learn to stipple - a system of fine dots that produces smooth tones. Learn how to combine stipple with line and crosshatching to create textures in pen and ink.

- Artists need to bring a selection of Micron pens or Copic Multiliner pens NOTE: pens must be fresh and crisp – not after being used for rough sketching or dried out.
 Suggested Copic Multiliner sizes 0.1, 0.3 and 0.7
 Suggested Sakura Pigma Micron sizes 0.1, 0.3 and 0.8
 If you already have Rapidographs and you prefer to use them, please do.
 If you are skilled with nib pen and ink and prefer to bring that, please do so.

Optional:

- · Small brush and Chinese white watercolor or white gouache
- Small cup to hold water
