Supply List

- Drawing Board: Foam board to support paper A3 in size or a little larger to support A3 size paper (11.69 x 16.53 inches).
- Paper
 - Hot Pressed Watercolour paper either Fabriano Artistico, or Saunders Waterford or equivalent Ideally 300 lbs / 640 gsm white, extra white or high white Tracing paper Sketching paper.
- Brushes: Winsor and Newton Series 7 sable watercolour brushes. No.2, No.4 pointed round, No. 5 round along with miniature or spotter No.1, No. 0 e.g. Cornelissen spotter.
- Pencils: HB, 2H, 2B, mechanical pencil 0.3 or 0.5
- · Eraser: Soft, putty (kneaded) eraser.
- Paint: Artists' quality transparent watercolours. Either Winsor and Newton or your own preferred brand.
- Sundries: Palette (white ceramic plate), masking tape, masking fluid, ox gall, water container, specimen container / support, paper kitchen towel, soft cloth for cleaning brushes, magnifying lens, portable battery operated light (eg. Ott Lites)
