

Supply List

- Hot Pressed watercolour paper, e.g. Fabriano Artistico 300 lb. or equivalent
- Pencil / Mechanical pencil. (0.3 or 0.5,) 2H / 4H
- Eraser
- Drawing and tracing paper, if normally used
- Artists' quality transparent watercolour paints. I use Winsor and Newton but please feel free to bring your preferred brand
- Brushes, W&N Series 7 Kolinsky Sables #00,#2, #4 or equivalent. Your brushes should have very good pointed tips for this class.
- Palette, e.g. a white dinner plate is perfect.
- · Drawing board, e.g. foam board
- Water jar(s)
- Paper towel
- Portable battery-operated light such as Ott Lites
- Magnifying lens with x3 magnification is preferred
