

Supply List:

Below is a list of my favorite colored pencils, paper and watercolor pencils. However for this class any watercolors and colored pencils are fine. Make sure you bring graphite pencils and whatever surface you like to draw on. Some people like to work on tracing paper, others on drawing paper, and myself I do preliminary work often on good watercolor paper.

Hand pencil sharpener or battery operated pencil sharpener: Graphite pencils assorted. H, 2H, HB Kneaded erasers Magnifying glass Small clear plastic ruler for measuring Small jar or vase for holding flowers and floral frog to prop up your cut flower specimen Hot pressed Fabriano Artistico watercolor paper. Available in the sheets 140lb or in blocks Tracing Paper Colored pencils: Faber-Castell polychromos colored pencils can be purchased at dickblick.com easily. Sets are also available but it is better to purchase individual colors. *Chrome Oxide Green 278 *Purple 194 Light colors for tints, highlights and burnishing White 101 *lvory 103 Burnt Ochre 187 Venetian Red 190 Yellow ochre 183 Burnt Sienna 283 Faber-Castell Albrect Durer Watercolour Pencils: These have the same color names as the Faber Castell polychromos. You only need to get colors listed above in bold face. Verithin pencils for sharpening edges, adding detail and burnishing *Dark Brown, *Black, *Gray 70%

* Colors that have a * are necessary colors. Everything else can be mixed from these if desired.

Bring a few watercolors and brushes.
