Painting Medium Palette - Small 2 Paint Brushes - Winsor Newton, Series 7, Kolinsky Sable # 1 & #3 or other quality fine point. Watercolor Paper - 11"x14"140 lb. block of hot-pressed Arches (or full sheet cut into quarters) Watercolor - Basic set of colors you usually use
