

- **1. Be inspired** by *The Botanical Artist*, a quarterly journal packed with great images and articles.
- **2. Gain national and international exposure** for your artwork: Create your own Member Gallery on ASBA's website.
- **3. Become eligible to enter** ASBA international exhibitions (juried and non-juried.) Benefit from associated outreach and programming.
- **4. Enjoy association** with over 1900 like-minded people who share a passion for botanical art. Connect with interest groups in online forums on the ASBA website.
- **5. Join a Chapter or Artists' Circle** and participate in local and regional activities—workshops, field trips, and outreach projects.
- **6. Tap ASBA's global network.** Enjoy association with over 300 international members from 40 countries who are botanical art leaders in their own countries.
- 7. Attend in-person and online ASBA Conferences.

Participate in workshops, classes, forums, and lectures with master artists and experts; share experiences and network with members; participate in exhibitions open to all attendees.

- **8. Post notices** of upcoming exhibitions, classes, or workshops on the ASBA website.
- **9. Include your name,** background, class offerings, and contact information in ASBA's online Teacher's Directory.
- **10. Make a Difference:** Apply for ASBA Artist Grants, currently valued at \$3000.

- **11. Receive ASBA's print Member Directory** and access the online directory.
- 12. Participate in ASBA's unique Travel Programs.
- **13. Access information and connect** on ASBA's social platforms: Instagram, Facebook private member group, Facebook public page, and ASBA's YouTube channel.
- 14. Access online tutorials, studio visits, and panel discussions with master artists.
- **15.** As a collector of botanical art, get to know the artists firsthand and **stay informed** about news.
- **16.** Share in ASBA's national stature, prestige, and international standing. List ASBA membership on your resume, at exhibitions, and on your business card.
- **17. Receive recognition and honor** when selected to participate in prestigious collaborative exhibitions.
- **18. Be a part of ASBA's Ambassador Program,** sharing the history and continuing tradition of botanical art, and promoting the unique ability of botanical art to impact environmental stewardship.
- **19. Through your affiliation** with ASBA and support of our Code of Ethics, you become a role model for members of other botanical societies around the world. Our "do no harm to plants" policy protects rare and endangered species—and all plants—in their natural habitats.
- **20. Benefit from ASBA's association** with over 40 prominent national and international institutions, all of which are ASBA Institutional Members in the forefront of the botanical world.
